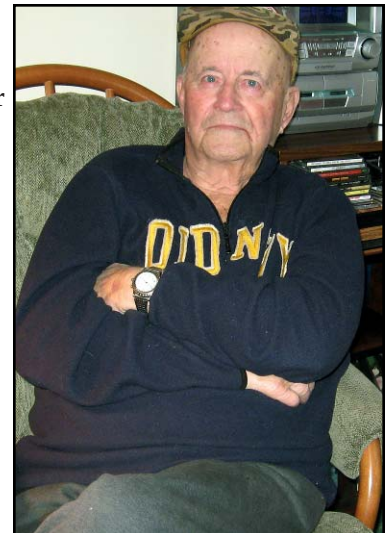
THEN AND NOW THE HAFFIE HOUSE 1086 Prince Street



This house at 1086 Prince Street was probably one of the oldest houses in Lansdowne. The date 1849 was said to be carved on a beam in the basement.

In the early part of the 1900s Dr. Bell lived, and had his practice, here.

A.E. Haffie purchased the building from George Peck in 1922. It was the home of Stanley Haffie and family for the next fifty years. John Haffie, who lays claim to being the oldest man in Lansdowne, was born there in 1924.



On Friday April 20 the house was destroyed by fire. It had to be demolished.

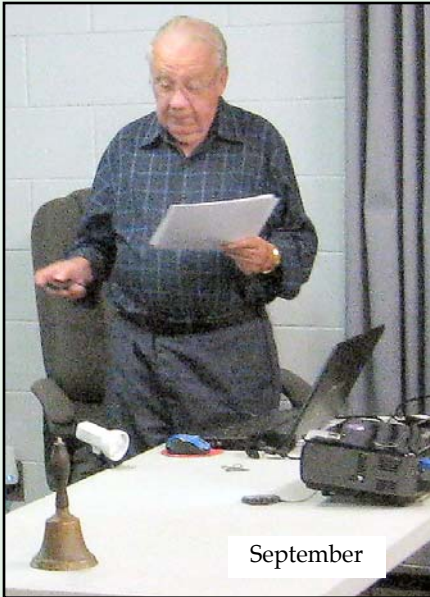

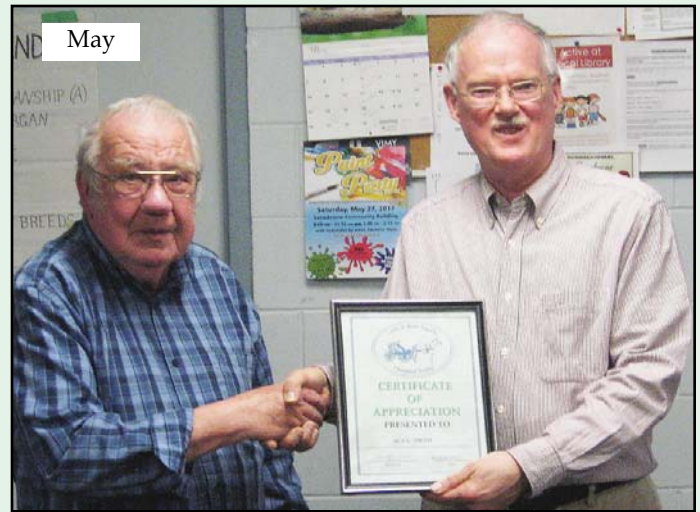

1868

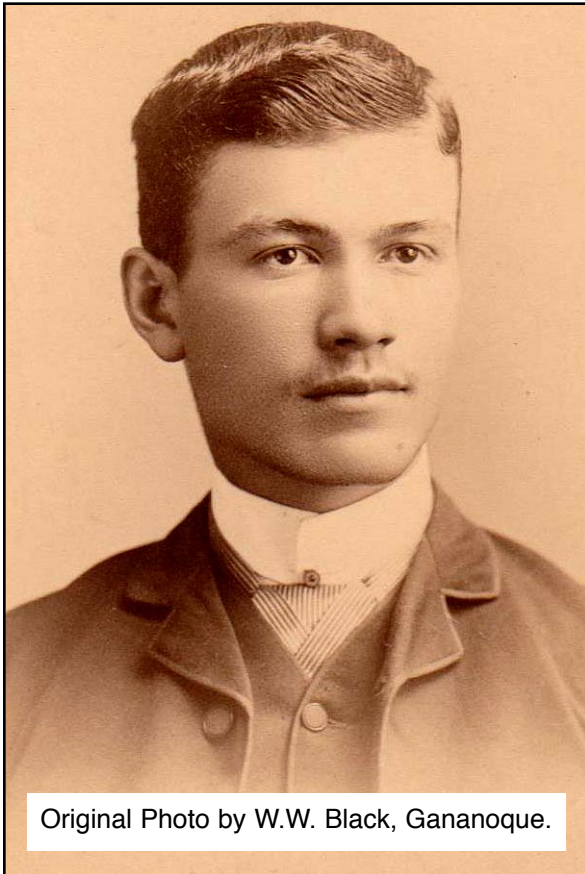
- Jan.** 1 Snowed all day. No work done.
3 Drew 1 load of wood. Horses slipped on the ice so that they could not draw.
4 Very high wind this morning with snow.
5 No work the roads is nearly full.
6 Went to school house and voted for council.
7 Ad came home from Young. I went to Mallorytown to meet Rob Beatty.
8 Finished the peas and went to school meeting.
10 Drew wood. Ad went to Gananoque.
11 Went to Young. Ellen went.
12 Rev. Carrol preached in the church.
13 Drew some wood. Killed 25 turkeys we intended to go to Kingston.
14 Went to Mr. Purvises in Pittsburg. Slept there all night.
15 Went to Kingston with turkeys. Got home about 11 o'clock.
16 Ad and Billie drew some wood.
17 Ad went to bee at Mr. Fullertons drawing wood.
18 Ad went to Young for a cutter & to see Luther Shipman he is going to collect from him.
19 No meeting today. Ad came home.
20 Wm. Curtice went home today on the Express. He has been here since Christmas.
21 Billie commenced to go to school.
22 I spaded. Ad went on a collecting tour.
23 A little snow.
25 We got home from B Youngs and drew a small stack of hay.
27 The boys are going to schools.
30 Billie went to Brockville with Henry Young and Jos Gilbert.
- Feb.** 1 Billie got home from Brockville.
2 No meeting today. Snow with strong wind.
3 Stormy this morning.
4 Billie went to Marble Rock Mill with 3 bags of wheat 2 of rye & 2 of buckwheat.
5 Dr. Richmond, his wife, and Miss Ferguson came here to visit. A fine day.
6 Snow and wind most of day.
8 Fine day the roads very bad.
9 Snow and wind no meeting today the roads is blocked up.
10 No stir today yet.
11 There has no team been on the roads yet the drifts were so great that the roads completely blocked up. The boys is going to School. I am cutting the wood.
12 Robert Beatty came here with a grist to go to Gananoque Mill last night him and Billy went today. Very stormy this morning.
13 Roby went home this morning very stormy this morning. .Snow this afternoon.
14 Snow this morning the Boys at school.



Lansdowne Businessman David Arthur Haig

For many years David Haig operated several businesses and investments in the area and was well known in the community. He was born in 1868 probably on the Haig homestead near Gananoque. His parents were John and Janet Haig. He had one brother Gibson (Gib) and a brother and sister, twins, who died shortly after birth. On January 10, 1872 his father was killed in a sawing accident. His mother remarried to John M. Darling and they had three children Annie, Jean and George.

His first business venture was operating a slaughter house on his step-father's farm. He learned the carpenter trade and his first major project was building a kitchen extension on the Darling house. On December 16, 1890 he married Elizabeth Wilahmina Cornett daughter of Thomas Cornett and shortly after they moved to Lansdowne village where he built a house on King St. below the hill. They had one child John who died in 1892 aged 10 months. Wilahmina passed away in 1926 and a stained glass window in the Church of the Covenant was erected in her memory.

With a business partner Marcus King he started a tinsmith business in the village. Their shop on Prince St. was easily recognized by a large copper tea kettle that hung out front. They also sold ornamental tin that was used on ceilings and walls. Interior tin ceilings and wall paneling on his house reflects his handiwork.

Along with Mr. King they built several early cottages in Ivy Lea including "Thelma," named for a book his wife was reading, and his own cottage "The Breezes".


Mr. King started a business on his own in Ivy Lea and Dave Haig was joined in the tinsmith business by Arthur

Burns under the name Haig and Burns. They continued the business for a few years.

Burns and Haig had a share in the telephone company and Dave Haig was president of the company from 1931 to 1937. He also owned shares in the arena company.

Haig and Burns purchased the gas plant that provided lighting to the village from Schyler DeWolfe and moved it to the top of the hill on the lot behind his house and the tin shop. It operated until an explosion destroyed it in 1930. Fortunately hydro had arrived in the village.

Along with Senator Harold Code, Ottawa lawyers Arthur Boyce and George Acheson and John D (Jack) Mitchell of Lansdowne he was a shareholder of the Thousand Island Bridge Company that began the process that led to the construction of the bridge. The company was sold to the Thousand Island Bridge Authority, their American partner, before the construction started but he is remembered for the role he played in its development.

He lived out his life in his home in Lansdowne where he died May 12, 1962. Along with his wife and son he is buried in Willowbank Cemetery. 



The Seeley's Bay Carriage Works - by Glenda Olivia

The building on the front cover was the home of the Seeley's Bay Carriage Works operated by the Bracken family and Gilbert family until the early 1900's. The picture is of this building as a lumber yard. Some of the ledger books and letters from this business are available for research and review at the Leeds and Thousand Islands Archives, Springfield House, Escott, ON. The Archives also contain a cheque/receipt book from this business.

As cars became the preferred mode of transportation, the Carriage Works became a Grist Mill. The grinding stones were imported from Ruan, France by the HARTELY FAMILY who had purchased the property. Pieces of these stones remain on the property and have become part of a beautiful fountain.



Subsequently, a lumber yard was added, while the grist mill remained active. Later, only the lumber yard was operated as a business. The lumber was milled at a mill on the water's edge across from the lumber yard, then sold at the site which is now 133 Bay Street, Seeley's Bay, ON.

Would you believe that this building is now the beautiful home of Gerrit and Johanna Van Vierzen who bought the property in 1983 and together with their family transformed the structure. As the renovation progressed the Van Vierzen's donated weigh scales and other equipment from the grist mill operation to the Delta Mill restoration. Johanna Van Vierzen has also donated two ledger books to the Archives: one from 1927 to 1932 and the other one from 1938 to 1940. **Thank you Johanna!**

The Colemans of Pitchpine Island - by Pierre Mercier

Many illustrious people have called the Thousand Islands their summer or full-time home. An excellent example was the brother and sister duo, the Colemans of Pitchpine Island. The island is part of the Admiralty Group, just off Gananoque.

Pitchpine Island was originally leased for use by D. Ford Jones a prominent politician from Brockville.

The lease was purchased by Professor Coleman and then the island was purchased from the Superintendent of Indian Affairs in 1887.

Arthur P. Coleman (1852-1939) was a renowned professor of geology, artist, explorer, canoeist, and museum administrator. He received many academic honours and appointments too numerous to list here. A mountain in Banff is named Mount Coleman in honour of his accomplishments. He was the first to realize there had been more than one Ice Age.

Helena Coleman (1860-1953) was a prolific published poet, musician and writer. She wrote under a number of male and female pseudonyms and was published in many United States and Canadian magazines such as Colliers, Atlantic Monthly, Ladies Home Journal, etc.. Her first book of poems, Songs and Sonnets (1916) was very successful. She was good friends and a mentor to a number of women poets and writers, notably Marjorie Pickthall, Agnes Maule Machar and Mazo de la Roche.

The current owners have done a magnificent job preserving the appearance of the property as shown by comparing historical photos of the cottage with a contemporary one.

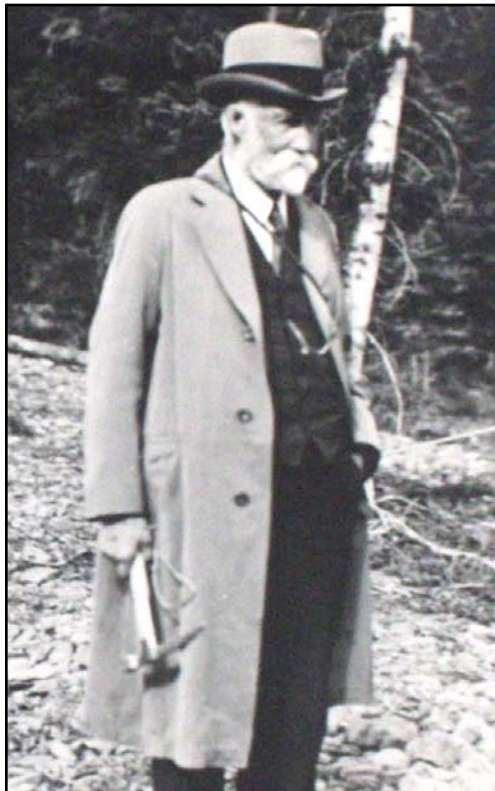

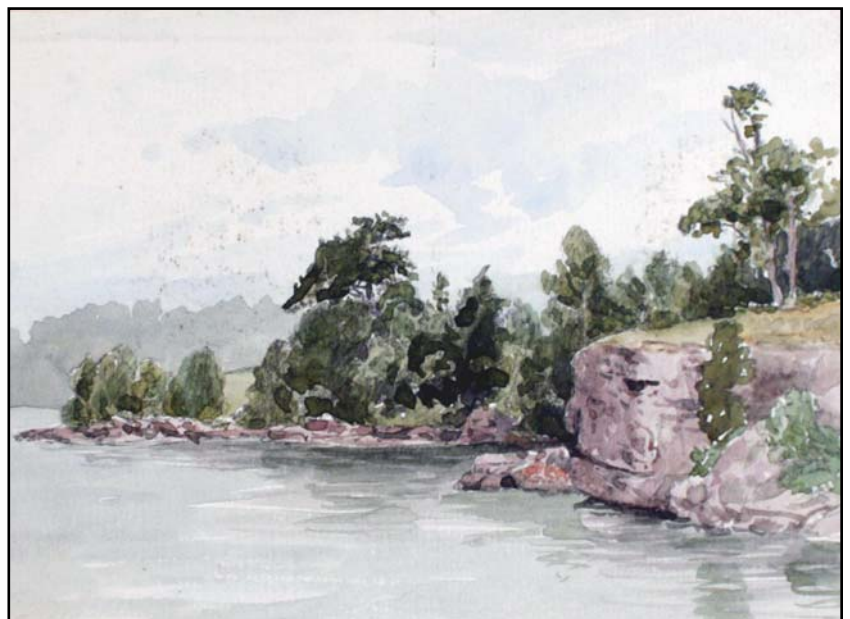

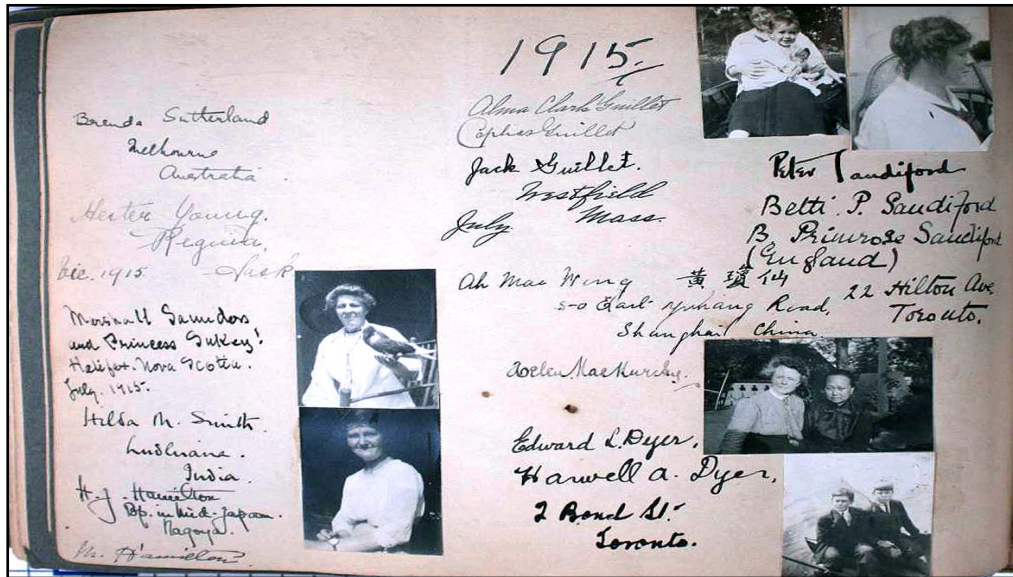

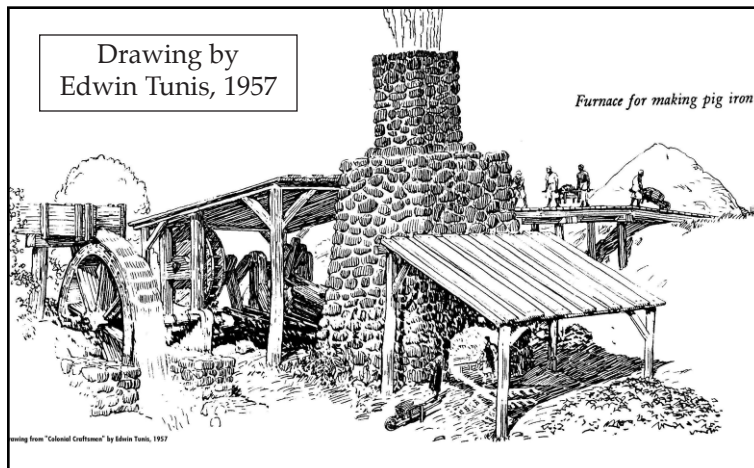
Did you know?

That the LTI HISTORICAL SOCIETY helped with the research for the historical marker "Schools of the Past" and supported the project financially.



The LTI HISTORICAL SOCIETY partnered with LAFR for the refurbishment of the Lansdowne Train Mural. Currently Wilhelmina Lacelle is researching for a Historical Plaque to be placed near the mural. This plaque will explain the importance and history of the trains in the Village of Lansdowne. The LTI HISTORICAL SOCIETY is financially supporting Wilhelmina's research.

In 2017 we supported the Archaeology dig at Lyndhurst, where the Lansdowne Iron Works was located. Today, this site is a **National Historic Site**, after being designated in 1932 by the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada. Work began at the Iron Works in 1800 making it the first smelter in Upper Canada. We are supporting the dig again this year.



We have currently partnered with the Veteran's Memorial Committee for the completion of the Memorial which has been placed in front of Thousand Islands Elementary School (TIES). Information about the **Ceremonial Dedication** of this memorial is included in this newsletter. Please plan to attend the **Ribbon Cutting on Saturday, September 22, 2018.**
